

## FROM RICK'S DESK

### Faith, Hope, and Love

Faith, hope, and love are mentioned in many different contexts in God's word. The author of Hebrews points out that these three virtues can work together effectively. "Let us draw near with a sincere heart in the assurance that faith brings, because we have had our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water. And let us hold unwaveringly to the hope that we confess, for the one who made the promise is trustworthy. And let us take thought of how to spur one another on to love and good works. (Heb. 10: 22-24)

#### Faith

An active faith is the foundation of all that we do. "Faith is being sure of what we hope for; being convinced of what we do not see." (Heb. 11:1; Heb. 6: 10-12). Indeed, faith in Christ's finished redemption provides the necessary encouragement to hold fast to our assured hope, regardless of life's difficulties. (1 Pet 3:15).

Throughout the Old and New Testaments, one thing is obvious; faith is a basic and necessary quality of a believer. Moreover, true faith in a Christian's life is not only belief and trust, but also loyalty. Our faith is to be both active and passive because it brings about a moral excellence in thought and deed.

#### Hope

There is value in the believer's hope. Our hope is based upon our salvation, that came to us by the grace of God. The Lord has granted salvation through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. 1 Thess. 5 tells us, "8 But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet."

A believer's salvation brings them into an eternal living union with Jesus Christ, one that may be described as "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Col. 1:27). Paul is so good at challenging believers to understand these things. We should be able to explain the hope we have, the spiritual riches waiting for us in glory, as well as the spiritual power available to believers now. This hope is reserved for and guaranteed only to believers and this is why Paul declares that the unbelievers "have no hope" (1 Thess. 4:13).

#### Love

Last, but certainly not least is love. First of all, like holiness and truth, love has its origin in God's attribute of perfection. Love is the language that God communicates with, and is expressed through His mercy and grace toward man. (2 Cor. 1:3; Eph. 2:4, Titus 2:11-12).

Like faith and hope, for man to love involves the whole soul. The commentator Barclay said it best. "It takes all of a man to achieve Christian love; it takes not only his heart; it takes his mind and his will as well." I also love how Paul stressed the importance of love to the church in Colossae. "12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. 13 Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. 14 And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."
